Submissions Summary

- Telsat, TVL and Digicel submitted <u>individual plans</u> within the deadline
- A <u>collective partial industry response</u> was submitted also by TVL, Digicel & Telsat within the deadline
- eTech and CNS submitted plans after the deadline
- Received responses but no plans from SPIM (on day of deadline), Can'l, Incite and Interchange(all three after day of deadline)
- No response from Skycloud, Hotspotz, Wavecom, Micoms & Yumi Konek

What plans has TRR received?

- Digicel to rollout new sites and upgrade existing sites
- TVL to rollout new sites and upgrade existing sites
- Telsat submitted plan for new sites, however, this was not as a play commitment
- CNS submitted plan, however, this was not as a play commitment
- e-Tech outlined a proposal for a potential Government Radio Network throughout Vanuatu
- Can'l has advised of potential rollout of broadband services
- No plans provided by Interchange, SPIM, Incite, Skycloud, Hotspotz, Wavecom, Micoms & Yumi
 Konek

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TRR comments on submissions

- Rollout plans <u>must be population based</u> and <u>not</u> <u>demand based</u>.
- The emphasis is on <u>unserved</u> and underserved areas
- Plans must show current pop % covered and new pop % covered in rollout plans and for what services; voice, narrowband or broadband services
- <u>All</u> broadband rollouts must be achieved by 1st of January 2018 – if in phases (by each year) must specify pop % gained in each phase of rollout
- TRR will only present aggregated coverage data to industry

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 In accordance with UAP, focus is on health, education facilities and public offices

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Next Steps(1)

- 1. <u>TRR will</u> :
 - a. Submit report to Minister by 7th of March 2014
 - b. Continue to work with Industry on all relevant aspects
 - c. Determine and inform each licensee of levy to be imposed to those who chose to pay, or do not play.
 - d. Finalize actual payers and players through oneon-one discussions





Next Steps(2)

2. <u>*Player* licensees</u> must provide by **COB Friday 28th February 2014** :

- a. Accurate & updated coverage maps (Prefer magnified maps by island)
- b. Analysis of current percentage of population covered by voice, narrowband and broadband services.
- c. Analysis of percentage increase in population to be covered by rollout plans.
- d. Confirm rollout plans to list of unserved and underserved areas provided. Include GPS coordinates
- e. Ensure to include education facilities, health facilities
 & public offices

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Next Steps(3)

- 3. Payer licensees must:
 - a. Provide audited & certified Financial statements for 2011-2012 and 2012-2013 by COB Friday 28th February 2014.
 - b. Work cooperatively with TRR to achieve the Government's UA policy intentions
 - c. Recognize and understand that this is a total industry approach: pay if you do not play. All licensees must be involved
